We installed and hand tightened the zerk fitting. You will need to tighten it and point it in the opposite direction than the one shown.



Note: Make sure you have received a complete kit. The picture (top left) shows all the parts and how they go together.

1) From middle chassis, raise the atv so that rear swing arm can hang freely.



- 2) Locate original rear strut, and undo bolt near bottom zerk fitting. The bushings and bearing should remain on the strut. Do the same with the upper bolt.
- 3) Install stock bearing and bushings into each end of new strut, making sure each side is secure.



Remove lower shock mount bolt.


- 4) Install strut into upper mounting first, making sure bushings slide easily in place. Replace stock bolt, but do not tighten. Repeat with bottom fitting.
- 5) Tighten all bolts, and check for binding. Each end should fit snug.

This is how your lowering kit should look when you're done! Bounce rear up & down, check for binding!
